Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we continue toward the end of the long season of Pentecost, let's see what the Bible says you can do to ... make better use of your time; please God; grow in the Spirit; influence your world; forgive others and count your blessings. We'll cover one topic a week for the six weeks between October 20 and November 30.

As we read last month, Luther wrote: "The Bible is alive, it speaks to me; it has feet, it runs after me; it has hands, it lays hold of me." Finish out the season of Pentecost growing in your faith and practice around these six topics letting the Bible speak to, runs after and lavs hold of you more and more!

So what will these new devos look like??

The calendar of readings on the reverse side begins on October 20. This will be a six-week study ending on November 30. These devos are for adults and youth. Families are certainly welcome to use them too, but there will be a special weekly Faith 5 devos handout for the upcoming-week at Sunday School. I also send this weekly via email to parents of our PreK- 5th grade students. The devos still include Sunday gospel readings on Saturdays. We encourage families with very young children to read children's Bible storybooks or to use the Read with Me Bible (see Pastor Amy if you want a copy!)
