

ADVENT – THE SEASON OF EXPECTATION

The season of Advent, the weeks before Christmas, is the beginning of the church year. Advent means a 'coming' or 'arrival'. While Christmas is first in our minds, the focus of Advent is on Christ's three arrivals: His birth, His coming to us today and His return at the end of time. The beginning of the church year moves us onward toward the end of time as we await Christ's coming again and the fulfillment of His plan for all creation. The color of Advent is blue, symbolizing hope.

READING: Luke 1:46-55 *Bible p. 832*

A: A reading from the 1st chapter of Luke.

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, ⁴⁷and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, ⁴⁸for he has looked with favor on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name. ⁵⁰His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. ⁵¹He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. ⁵²He has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; ⁵³he has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, ⁵⁵according to the promise he made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants for ever."

CHRISTMAS – THE SEASON OF EMMANUEL

Welcome Jesus! Welcome Emmanuel, God with us. The season of Christmas begins with the celebration of Jesus' birth and continues for twelve days, ending on January 5. This is the season of gift giving: most importantly God's gift, given to us in Jesus. The color of Christmas is white, symbolizing Jesus' light and purity.

READING: Luke 2:1-7 *Bible p. 832-833*

A: A reading from the 2nd Chapter of Luke.

¹ In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ² This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. ⁵ He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

EPIPHANY – JESUS LIGHT OF THE WORLD

January 6 is Epiphany Day when we celebrate the Magi coming to see Jesus. The season of Epiphany also includes the celebration of Jesus' baptism, the beginning of his public ministry and miraculous manifestations of His power. The color for Epiphany is green, reflecting Jesus' growing mission.

READING: Isaiah 60:1-6

A: A reading from the 60th chapter of Isaiah.

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. ²For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. ³Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. ⁴Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. ⁵Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. ⁶A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD.

LENT – THE SEASON OF TURNING TO GOD

Lent marks the forty days before Easter and symbolizes Jesus' forty days in the wilderness. Beginning with Ash Wednesday, Lent is a time of preparation and thoughtful reflection on our sinfulness and life of faith. Historically, Lenten disciplines have included giving, prayer, and fasting. The color of Lent is purple, symbolizing repentance and solemness.

A: Let us read responsively from Psalm 51.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.

¹¹Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me.

¹²Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.

¹³Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.

¹⁴Deliver me from bloodshed, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance.

¹⁵O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.

¹⁶For you have no delight in sacrifice; if I were to give a burnt-offering, you would not be pleased.

¹⁷The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

P: God of all mercy and consolation, come to the aid of your people, turning us from our sin to live for you alone. Give us the power of your Holy Spirit that, attentive to your Word, we may confess our sins, receive your forgiveness, and grow into the fullness of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

Silence for reflection and self-examination.

P: Most merciful God,

C: we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen

The presiding minister announces God's forgiveness.

P: In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus Christ was given to die for us, and for his sake God forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ, and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

HOLY WEEK

At the end of Lent, we mark Jesus' final week. Palm Sunday highlights Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and includes the reading of the Passion narrative from one of the Gospels. On Thursday, before His arrest Jesus ate His Last Supper with His disciples. And on Good Friday we gather in worship. The sanctuary grows gradually darker as we hear Jesus' Seven Last Words from the cross.

WORDS OF INSTITUTION:



This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

For those at home or communing at their seat, please receive the bread and wine as the pastor speaks the words:

If you desire to receive communion up front, please come forward via the center aisle. As the pastor and communion assistant give the bread and wine, they say these words to each communicant:

The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. *The communicant may say: "Amen."*

A: A reading from the 15th chapter of Mark.

It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. ²⁶The inscription of the charge against him read, 'The King of the Jews.' ²⁷And with him they crucified two bandits, one on his right and one on his left. ²⁹Those who passed by derided him, shaking their heads and saying, "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and build it in three days, ³⁰save yourself, and come down from the cross!" ³¹In the same way the chief priests, along with the scribes, were also mocking him among themselves and saying, "He saved others; he cannot save himself. ³²Let the Messiah, the King of Israel, come down from the cross now, so that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with him also taunted him.

³³When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. ³⁴At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" ³⁵When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "Listen, he is calling for Elijah." ³⁶And someone ran, filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink, saying, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take him down." ³⁷Then Jesus gave a loud cry and breathed his last. ³⁸And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. ³⁹Now when the centurion, who stood facing him, saw that in this way he breathed his last, he said, "Truly this man was God's Son!"

⁴⁰There were also women looking on from a distance; among them were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome. ⁴¹These used to follow him and provided for him when he was in Galilee; and there were many other women who had come up with him to Jerusalem.

Silent Reflection

EASTER - THE SEASON OF LIFE

Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, alleluia! This greeting rings out on Easter Sunday as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection. Easter is the high point of the church year, with the celebration lasting fifty days. One day is not enough to rejoice at God's triumph over death and evil. Through this season, our focus is on the risen Christ and His appearances. The color of Easter is white, symbolizing joy and the brightness of the resurrection dawn.

READING: Luke 24:1-12 *Bible p. 860*

A: A reading from the 24th chapter of Luke.

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3but when they went in, they did not find the body. ⁴While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. ⁵The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. ⁶Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, 7that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." 8Then they remembered his words, ⁹and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. ¹¹But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹²But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

PENTECOST – THE DAY OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Pentecost is the fiftieth day of Easter, when we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the church. The color of Pentecost Day is red, symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit.

READING: Acts 2:1-6, 43-47 *Bible p. 885*

A: A reading from the 2nd chapter of Acts.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

⁴³Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. ⁴⁴All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

A: The word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

PENTECOST – THE SEASON OF GROWING

The rest of the church year is the Season of Pentecost. Through this long season, our focus is on Jesus' ministry and teachings. The color of the time after Pentecost is green, symbolizing growth in faith.

READING: Matthew 13:1-9Bible p. 794

A: A reading from the 13th chapter of Matthew.

That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. ²Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. ⁴And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. ⁵Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. ⁶But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹Let anyone with ears listen!"


